Providing snacks or other materials

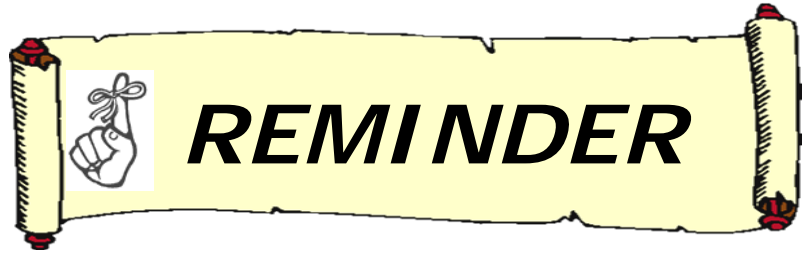
We are trying to cut back on paper usage, so if you are interested in helping please send one of us an email message or sign up on the bulletin board in Memorial Hall.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last month I asked Sue to put an article in the REMINDER about children and prayer. I hope you cut it out and put that very important article on your fridge as a reminder to yourselves to pray with your children! Here is another way of teaching the little ones about praying. It's called the "five finger prayer". A friend of mine who is pastoring a church in Texas sent it to me. This is how it goes:

First, your thumb teaches you to pray for all those closest to you-parents, siblings, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins.

Your index ("pointer") finger teaches you to pray for those around you who point the way: for children this would be parents, teachers, pastors, and others; most adults can point to any number of people who have pointed the way for us.

Your middle ("tall man") finger teaches you to pray for those in authority-leaders in every level of our government and throughout the world, church leaders, and others who possess power over others.

Your ring finger (which is said to be our weakest finger) teaches you to pray for those who lack power, resources, and options-the homeless; the poor; those who suffer from low intelligence, mental health problems, physical disabilities, and illness; and others who suffer in other ways.

Finally, your smallest ("pinkie") finger teaches you to pray (last) for yourself-your own wants, needs, and problems.

HOWEVER, despite these instructions, there is no wrong way to pray. The Bible is full of prayers which don't fit the model of either the five-finger prayer or the Lord's Prayer. The Old Testament, particularly, is filled with angry prayers of protest and complaint, or prayers striking a delicate bargain with God, and many other kinds of prayers. There is anger and anguish in Jesus prayer from the cross: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" God listens to them all.

The Grab bag Express allows you to enter "fast track" line in which you can purchase a bowl, but it has been selected for you. The bowls are to be taken home as a reminder that someone's bowl is always empty.

Dear Partners in Ministry,

Thank you all so much for your generous and fine support of Florist Avenue's Summer Lunch Program. This was my first exposure to this ministry, and I was blown away by the skill of leaders and volunteers and the participation of the children. In one day's art project, the group made a wall hanging and gave it to the church—we will post the photo on our website,

The program was a big success and a joy to behold.

Also, Florist's Saturday Lunch Program (Saturday Soul Day) is growing by leaps and bounds. We have gone from an average of 5 participants in the early days, to between 25-35 for most Saturdays, currently.

We obtain frozen prepared food weekly which can be warmed and enhanced by sauces etc., or you would be welcome to prepare your own menus. - Dec. 4, 11, 18 (In December we also work together for our Christmas Party, and will be in touch with our partners to get more information out to you regarding this event.)

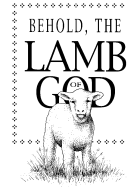
